THE PALMER BIENNIAL IS A UNIQUE EVENT

The first Palmer Sculpture Biennial was held in 2004, and since then has gained an impressive reputation both locally and internationally. The event is now one of the longest, continually running sculpture exhibitions in Australia. People who have experienced past biennials now make a point of returning.

The biennial is run by the artists, and rather than aiming to show many works, the emphasis is on quality, artistic merit, and the way they interact with an Australian environment. A high priority is that visitors should be able to engage with both sculpture and place.

Other speakers are Greg Johns, Pam Dean (Ma Hth Sc), and Bill Clifford.


THE ARTISTS

The artists include three from interstate, one from overseas and fifteen South Australians. Amongst their ranks are leading sculptors with widespread reputations as well as exciting visionary newcomers.

HONOURED ARTIST

Stelarc from Victoria

Stelarc's works have broken new ground, re-imagining the human body technologically in terms of robotics, AI and virtual systems, and often featuring performances involving bodily modifications. At the Biennial, he will be collaborating with emerging SA artist Anika Gardner. Their work will be called "rockProsthesis (metal, muscles, code)".

"The spread of sculpture exhibitions and competitions throughout Australia in recent years has been remarkable; the development of Palmer in South Australia, however, remains unique. Some seaside sights such as Lorne and Bondi are easily accessible and justifiably popular with the public. The Biennial takes place in a hilly 400-acre property near the township of Palmer on the way to Mannum. Strolling over a rise in a landscape that includes escarpments, rocky outcrops and open countryside and suddenly encountering a striking sculpture is an unforgettable experience. In such a setting, these works have much greater impact than they could achieve in a Gallery.






COST

- Verandah Music Event from 3pm 16th March is \$20 per head.
- The Palmer Biennial is a **CASH ONLY** event. All money raised is distributed to the musicians and to the ongoing restoration of the landscape.

WHERE IS THE PLAMER BIENNIAL

The property is 3.5 km down the Davenport Road which starts opposite the Hotel at Palmer on the way to Mannum. Approximately 1hr 15 minutes from Adelaide.







PARKING & OTHER EVENT INFORMATION

- Angle parking is available on Davenport Road near the entrance to the Palmer Biennial.
 If you have difficulty walking up the steep hill, we can usually offer limited 4x4 lifts to the top.
- 4x4 Access only inside the site. Limited parking at the top of the hill. Please always stay
 on the tracks drive slowly and be very careful of the wildlife. E.g., native lizards,
 Echidna, Euro wallaby and kangaroos. We have spent over 20 years gradually
 rehabilitating the landscape with native plantings, weed and vermin eradication. Please
 enjoy the event and remove your own rubbish from the site.
- Towards the end of the opening day on the 16^{th of} March, the Palmer Verandah Music Event begins at 3:00 pm. Cost \$20 p/p and cash only. Performers will be <u>Jen Lush</u> and band, <u>Aaron Thomas</u>, and band, <u>Snooks LaVie</u> and Nick Kipridis.
- **BYO** Bush Walking Gear, water, food, and a chair if you wish to stay for the music event on day 1. To make the most of your visit and see the works on display you would be advised to set aside 2 to 4 hours.



COVID-19


- For any attendance requirements due to COVID-19 restrictions please refer to the latest information from SA Health.
